#### **DIRECTIONS AND PARKING**

#### From North of Philadelphia in Pennsylvania

Follow I-95 South to Exit 22. Take 676 West/Central Philadelphia Exit. Follow 676 West to the first exit, which is Broad Street/Central Philadelphia. This exit will bring you onto 15th Street. Continue on 15th Street until you see City Hall on your left. Bear left around City Hall. Make a right at the first light, which is Broad Street. Take Broad Street two blocks to Sansom Street. Make a right onto Sansom. The Midtown Parking Garage is on the right. The entrance to the Union League is directly across the street on the left. Look for the awning.

#### From South of Philadelphia (Philadelphia International Airport) in Pennsylvania

Follow I-95 North to Exit 22. Follow signs for 676 West/Central Philadelphia Exit. Exit to the left. Follow 676 West to the first exit which is Broad Street/Central Philadelphia. This exit will bring you onto 15th Street. Continue on 15th Street until you see City Hall on your left. Bear left around City Hall. Make a right at the first light, which is Broad Street. Take Broad Street two blocks to Sansom Street. Make a right onto Sansom. The Midtown Parking Garage is on the right. The entrance to the Union League is directly across the street on the left. Look for the awning.

#### From East of Philadelphia in New Jersey

Benjamin Franklin Bridge to 676 West/Central Philadelphia Exit. Get on 676 West, then take the first exit, which is Broad Street/Central Philadelphia. This exit will bring you onto 15th Street. Continue on 15th Street until you see City Hall on your left. Bear left around City Hall. Make a right at the first light, which is Broad Street. Take Broad Street two blocks to Sansom Street. Make a right onto Sansom. The Midtown Parking Garage is on the right. The entrance to the Union League is directly across the street on the left. Look for the awning.

#### From West of Philadelphia in Pennsylvania

Take the PA Turnpike to Exit 326, which is the Valley Forge Exit. When you exit, take 76 East to Exit 344, which is 676 East/Central Philadelphia Exit. Take the second exit, which is Broad Street/Central Philadelphia. Stay in the right hand lane as you exit. Make a right at the light, which is 15th Street. Continue on 15th Street until you see City Hall on your left. Bear left around City Hall. Make a right at the first light, which is Broad Street. Take Broad Street two blocks to Sansom Street. Make a right onto Sansom. The Midtown Parking Garage is on the right. The entrance to the Union League is directly across the street on the left. Look for the awning.

#### From New Jersey Turnpike

Take Turnpike to Exit 4. Take NJ Route 73 North, follow onto NJ-90 West which becomes Betsy Ross Bridge. Exit bridge onto I-95 South to I-676 West to Central Philadelphia, and follow directions from East of Philadelphia in Pennsylvania.

<u>Parking:</u> There are several parking lots in the vicinity of the Union League. The closest/recommend garage is Midtown Garage (1415 Sansom Street). There is no parking discount available for attending this meeting.

<u>Public Transportation</u>: The Union League is located near the City Hall station on the SEPTA Broad Street line and the 15th Street station on the SEPTA Market-Frankford line. It is also several blocks from the 12<sup>th</sup>-13<sup>th</sup> and Locust stop on the PATCO High Speed Line.

Dr. Mike Cirigliano (Associate Professor of Medicine; University of Pennsylvania)

Dr. Mike Cirigliano is an Associate Professor of Medicine and practicing Internist at the Perelman School of Medicine at the University of Pennsylvania. He has over sixty publications in the medical literature and has been published in journals including the *Journal of the American Medical Association, Hospital Practice* and the *Journal of Women's Health*. He has lectured throughout the country and has served on the editorial board of the Facts and Comparisons publication *Review of Natural Products*, and *Hospital Physician*. Dr. Cirigliano practices Internal Medicine full time and treats a full range of medical disorders in the adult patient population.

Dr. Cirigliano currently serves as the medical correspondent and on air personality for the FOX 29 News program "Good Day Philadelphia." He has also been on the Dr Oz show and the Montel Williams show. Over the years, "Dr. Mike" has covered innumerable medical topics including sports injuries to infectious disease. He has a special interest in prevention and healthy living.

Dr. Cirigliano was featured in *Philadelphia Magazine's* "Top Docs" issue every year since 1996. He was also recognized by the Castle Connelly publication "Best Doctors In America" every year since 2008.

Dr. Cirigliano was born and raised in the Philadelphia area. He is married and has two children, Amy and Nicholas. His interests include aviation and ice hockey. He is a terrible hockey player.

Kathleen Stitzlein is the President/CEO of Triple Beam Technology; a start-up created to commercialize the Cannibuster technology for on-site marijuana detection. She has over 15 years of product development and fabrication experience in hydraulics, mechanical and thermal design of shell & tube heat exchangers and pressure vessels. TRICOR Metals most recently employed her as Engineering Manager.

Ms. Stitzlein is leading the design efforts for the microfluidic technology for the quantitative detection of cannabinoids in saliva. Her research involves the design of novel microfluidic devices for medical diagnostics. She has recently served as the Entrepreneurial Lead for the "Marijuana Impairment Test Device" research at The University of Akron funded by a TVSF grant from the state of Ohio. In addition to her BS in Biomedical Engineering, Ms. Stitzlein also holds an MS in Mechanical Engineering from University of Akron.



#### **Union League: Dress Code**


As guests at the Union League, attendees at this Professional Development Course will be required to meet the Union League's dress code:
